“Sailing with “Jensine” in the Danish South Sea”

during the period of **Tuesday 4th of August to Monday 17th of August 2026**


The themes of the camp are: *See Southern Jutland (6 days) and go sailing with Jensine (1 week).*

Haderslev is a town in southern Denmark, located on the beautiful east coast of the peninsula Jutland. The first days you will stay at a Beach Hostel near Haderslev in the Southern part of Denmark. After a few days exploring sights and social activities in the local area the “summer campers” will go on board “Jensine of Haderslev”. This is the oldest wooden sailing ship in Denmark. The guests are the crew! A certified Captain and 1st Officer will be in charge on board.

A maximum of 11 young people no younger than 17 and no older than 21 can join this camp. You are invited to send one girl or one boy.

ACCOMODATION: At a Beach Hostel near Haderslev under supervision of Rotarians before and after the sailing trip as well as on board the ship “Jensine” (2nd week from August 8th to 15th).

INSURANCE: The guests are expected to bring their own insurance (health, risks and accidents).

COSTS: The guests pay for their own trip to/from via Billund Airport (or Vojens Train Station in Southern Jutland), from where pick-up will be arranged. Further a participation fee **€uro 400** Euro will be charged. This amount will be collected by bank-transfer to Haderslev Rotary Club (IBAN Account DK0530000013494053, BIC Swift: DABADKKK) or alternatively, by  **PayPal** to the “Camp Leader” at kim@fuglsang.dk.

All other expenses are paid for by the Rotary Clubs, but we advise the guests to bring their own pocket money.
